The Civic Centre provides historical data and showcases the architectural remains of the parish's old Court House, and faces the St. Mary Parish Library, which hosts the national monument to Tacky, a maroon rebel leader.

Port Maria itself is rich in history. It was once a booming town and major shipping point for bananas and coconuts, but is now a sleepy fishing village. In fact Belafonte's famous Banana Boat song is from a chant sung by the workers as they loaded the banana boats in the harbors of Port Maria, Oracabessa and Port Antonio. Noel Coward made his home here (directly above the hotel) as did Ian Fleming and Errol Flynn. The 007 bar at Casa Maria was thus named because Ian Fleming was a regular patron at the bar.
