The Heart of Ska festival will be held at Ranny Williams Entertainment Centre, starting at 12 noon, with the daytime programme free of cost. The Main show, which will be held at 8pm, will focus on "Ska Rebirth," will be led by master drummer Sparrow Martin and will include Skalarreg, Eric Monty Morris- original lead singer of the Skatalites - Derrick Morgan, Stranjah Cole and Bunny & Skully.

There will be a special guest performance by American Jazz Trombonist Delfeayo Marsalis. The festival will feature film presentations, exhibitions showcasing photos and artifacts of The Skatalites and The Ska Era, panel discussions, interactive competitions, all day entertainment and the best “Duppy’ Bands from across the island.
